Christina Tomlinson is the Acting Director of the Office of Public Diplomacy in the Bureau of European and Eurasian Affairs, where she has served since May 2012.

In this capacity, she provides policy, management, personnel and resource oversight to U.S. public diplomacy implementation in Europe and Eurasia.

Before her current assignment, Christina served as the Special Assistant to Special Representative for Afghanistan and Pakistan Ambassador Marc Grossman, and as a Senior Watch Officer in the Operations Center. Other Washington tours include as a Special Assistant in the Executive Secretariat and as a Watch Officer in the Operations Center.

Christina's last overseas tour was as Assistant Public Affairs Officer at the U.S. Consulate General in Istanbul, Turkey. She has also served the Department of State as an Economic Officer in Budapest, Hungary, as a Consular Officer in Guangzhou, China, and as an intern in Vientiane, Laos.

Before joining the Foreign Service in 1998, Christina was a Presidential Management Fellow at the U.S. Department of Commerce and the Administrative Officer of the United Nations Information Centre in Washington, D.C. She has studied French, Laotian, Mandarin Chinese, Hungarian, and Turkish. She holds degrees in international affairs from Brigham Young University and George Washington University.
